



A crash course in privilege in scholarship

- 41% of full-time faculty are white males, 35% white females, others in single digits; discrepancy even larger when factoring in rank (NCES, 2019)
- Non-white academics underrepresented in publication, citation, and editorial positions in Communications (Chakravarrty et. al., 2018)
- Women not on/poorly represented in ecology journal boards - much less than the number of women who represent the societies that own the journals (Fox et. al., 2019)
- 1990-2011, publications indexed in JSTOR: only 27% from women (Eigenfactor)
- Men cite themselves 56% more than women do (King et. al., 2017)






